Traineeship sets Cassie's sights on returning home to teach

Cassie Puruntatameri, 21, says that when she started her traineeship she was shy and scared to speak up.

Cassie, a proud Aboriginal Tiwi woman from the small community Pirlangimpi on Melville Island, Northern Territory, arrived in Melbourne in 2016 on her own to undertake a traineeship, after securing the Department of Education and Training (DET) as a host employer for her Certificate III in Business through the Ai Group Apprentice and Trainee Centre.

"Coming out of my shell has been the greatest change I have felt and seen," she says.

An example was when she did her first presentation to about 200 people about her move to Melbourne and her traineeship journey to the Higher Education and Skills Group at DET.

"While I was terrified at the time, I felt passionate about what I was saying and felt that I spoke well and clear," she says.

Her presentation received great feedback and people said they were inspired by her story.

She says she loves working at DET and seeing how education and the VET sector changes people's lives.



"It's rewarding to be part of the reason why people like myself succeed in training, and how my work contributes to the delivery of education."

Leaving school before completing Year 12, then working at the local store and pub, Cassie always harboured dreams of one day being a teacher.

She now plans to further her studies in business, eventually study to become a teacher and return home to teach and do great things for her community.
