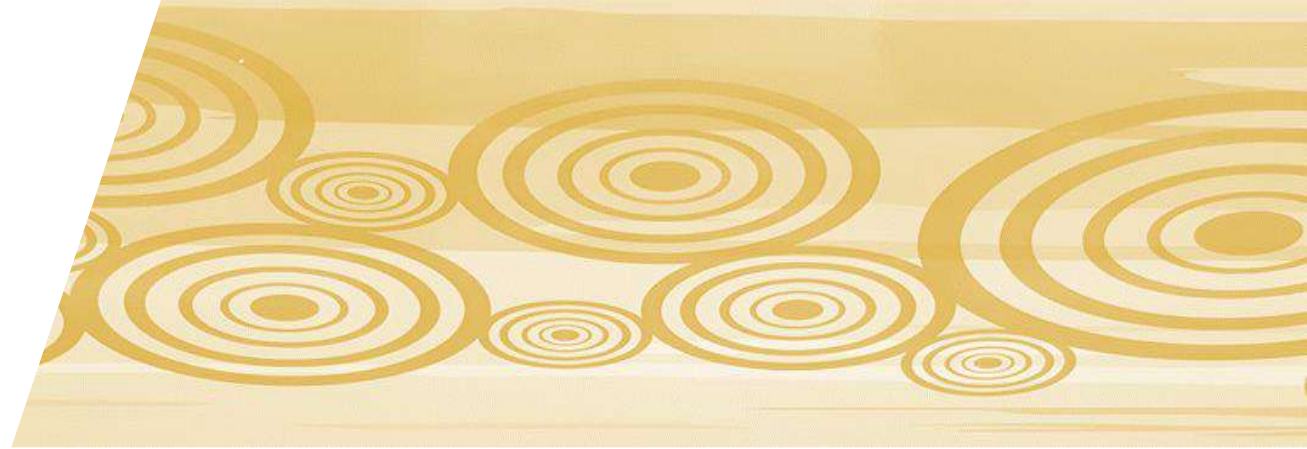

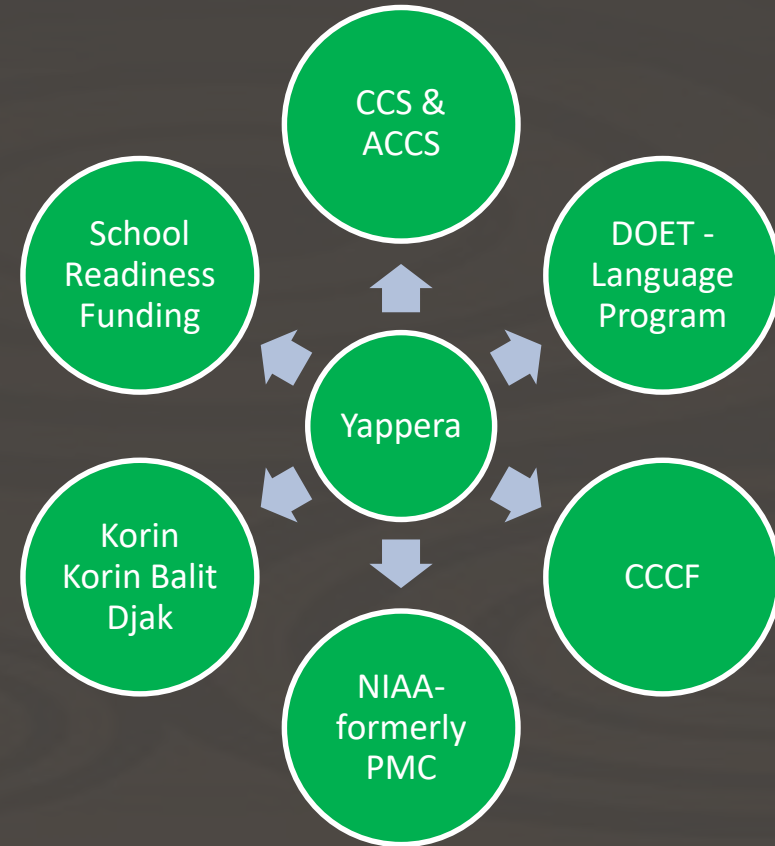

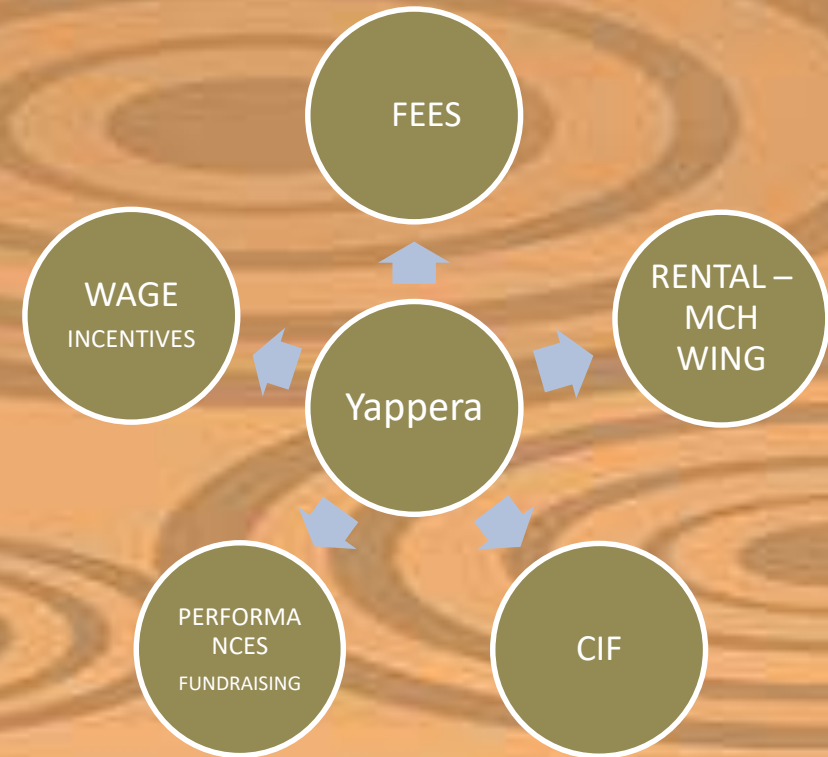

When can my child start kindergarten?

In Victoria, all children can go to kindergarten in the year before they start primary school. All Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can also go to kindergarten as a three-year-old, if they turn three years old by 30 April in the year they start.

Where can I find a kindergarten?

Some kindergartens run as just a kindergarten program. Other kindergarten programs are run through a child care or long day care centre. Some are at local schools.
